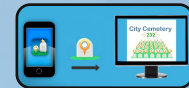
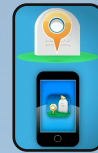




The BillionGraves Project brings people together by making genealogy records available to the public.

Volunteers use smartphones to take GPS-encoded pictures of headstones in cemeteries, which are then uploaded to the Internet and transcribed for easy searching. The information on the headstones is then made available to the public.

BillionGraves software is free, easy to use, and available for desktop computers and smartphones.



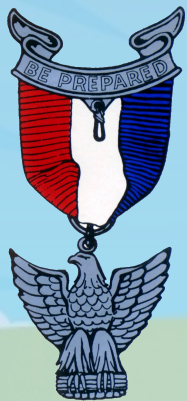
EAGLE SCOUT PROJECTS

Completing an Eagle Scout Project using BillionGraves requires leadership, planning, and teamwork.

BillionGraves is the most efficient way to gather headstone data in the world. A single, average user can collect over 500 images in about an hour, and a well-organized Scout Troop can map an entire small cemetery in a single afternoon.



TIPS FOR GETTING STARTED



- ✓ Find a local cemetery that has not already been mapped. If you have questions how to do this, contact us!
- ✓ Organize your group of image collectors, and find out how many have smartphones.
- ✓ If you want, you can form a team online to track your group's progress throughout the Eagle Project.
- ✓ Plan when your event is going to happen, and then plan when you will train your volunteers how to take pictures.
- ✓ Volunteers without smartphones can help by sweeping headstones or by transcribing images online later.
- ✓ Once you have captured as many headstone photos as you can, have your volunteers upload them.
